1	City Development Platform	The project aims to ensure the uninterrupted operation of the civil society organization and maintain the community's access to key services in emergency situations caused by the war. The project will introduce a crisis management and response system, enhance the physical and technical security of the office, and prepare the team to respond to crisis scenarios. This will enable the organization to respond promptly to emergencies without suspending key operations and to serve as a stable operational partner for the community.	54967,71
2	Caritas-Dolyna	The project aims to ensure 100% energy independence of the organization's Center by installing a high-capacity inverter system to provide uninterrupted psychosocial services in the Dolyna territorial community. This will enable the organization to conduct a comprehensive social adaptation program for 50 children and provide 60 individual consultations with a psychologist regardless of power outage schedules. The project aims to create a stable “island of resilience” for professional support to children and their families in crisis conditions.	77109,01
3	Kharkiv Agency for Reintegration and Coordination of Veterans' Initiatives	The project aims to strengthen the operational and organizational capacity of a veteran-led initiative that already operates heating points for the civilian population of Kharkiv amid the energy crisis. The project is crisis-oriented and is being implemented during a period of peak demand for civil society emergency response initiatives.	92310,50
4	United Nation	The project aims to ensure the organization's operational resilience amid prolonged energy and infrastructure crises in Kharkiv. The initiative will introduce a comprehensive set of measures to ensure continuity of financial and program management, including backup power supply, data protection, and crisis response planning. This will enable the organization to complete its ongoing programs on time, provide stable support to vulnerable groups, and properly fulfill reporting obligations to donors and partners.	68571,94

5	YASA	The project involves purchasing mobile equipment (a generator, an EcoFlow power station, and warm clothing) for the rapid deployment of mobile social support hubs during crisis periods and emergencies in the Novobasanska community, or, if necessary, in other communities of Nizhyn District upon request. In parallel, a series of trainings will be organized by a medical professional, a police officer, and an emergency response specialist to teach residents of the Novobasanska community first aid, basic safety principles, and crisis response procedures. This combination of technical resources and professional knowledge will ensure comprehensive community resilience and preparedness for a wide range of challenges.	195195,95
